This product has not been reviewed for carcinogenicity by IARC, NTP, OSHA or ACGIH. It contains titanium dioxide which is not listed as a carcinogen by NTP, OSHA, or ACGIH. However, in 2006, IARC released Monograph Vol. 93 in which it reclassified titanium dioxide from not classifiable as to its carcinogenicity to humans (Group 3) to possibly carcinogenic to humans (Group 2B). The reclassification was based on two studies in which rats were exposed to extremely high concentrations of titanium dioxide pigment powders in a closed chamber for extended periods of time. It is important to note that the results of epidemiology studies which evaluated more than 20,000 titanium dioxide industry workers in Europe and the US did NOT suggest a carcinogenic effect from titanium dioxide dust on the human lung or mortality from other chronic diseases including respiratory diseases not associated with titanium dioxide dust. Based upon the results of these studies, the pigment manufacturer(s) conclude that TiO2 will not cause lung cancer or chronic respiratory disease in humans at concentrations experienced in the workplace. additional information, see Section 15
